In Recognition of an Inspiring Life: Heydar Aliyev

Our nationwide leader, the architect of modern Azerbaijan, Heydar Aliyev was born on May 10, 1923. As our school is named in honor of Heydar Aliyev, we had a special event for this occasion.

Heydar Aliyev was born on 10th of May in 1923 in Nakhchivan and passed away on 12th of December in 2003 in Cleveland, Ohio. He graduated from the Nakhchivan pedagogical school.



After graduating in 1939 he entered the Architecture Department of the industrial institute of Azerbaijan (now state of Oil Academy of Azerbaijan). Heydar Aliyev headed a department at the People's Commissariat of Internal Affairs of the Autonomous Soviet Socialist Republic of Nakhchivan since 1941, and in 1944, he was sent to work at state security bodies. He received an education in the cities of Leningrad and Moscow. Heydar Aliyev graduated from the History Department of the Azerbaijan State University in 1957. Later he worked for 25 years at state security bodies. Heydar Aliyev worked as a deputy chairman of the State Security Committee under the Council of Ministers of the Azerbaijan SSR since 1964. From 1967 he held the office of chairman of the committee and rose to the rank of a major general.



Heydar Aliyev was appointed a first deputy chairman of the USSR's Council of Ministers. While he was in this position, he headed the most significant areas of the USSR's economic, social and cultural lives. Heydar Aliyev has been a deputy of the Supreme Soviets of the USSR and the Azerbaijan SSR for 20 years, and worked as a first deputy chairman of the USSR's Council of Ministers for 5 years.

In bound with the tragedy committed on 20 January 1990 in Baku by the Soviet troops, Heydar Aliyev, appearing the next day at the Representative Office of Azerbaijan in Moscow with a statement, demanded that the organizers and executors of the crime committed against the people of Azerbaijan be punished. Heydar Aliyev had held the post of chairman of the Supreme Assembly of the Autonomous Republic of Nakhchivan in 1991-1993.

In 1992 at the constituent congress of the New Azerbaijan Party in Nakhchivan, he was elected chairman of the party. In May-June 1993, when as a result of a crisis in the government, the country was on the verge of a civil war and faced the peril of losing



independence, the people of Azerbaijan demanded to bring Heydar Aliyev to power, and then leaders of Azerbaijan were obliged to officially invite Heydar Aliyev to Baku. On 15 June 1993, Heydar Aliyev was elected chairman of the Supreme Soviet of Azerbaijan, and on 24 June, by a resolution of the National Assembly, he proceeded to fulfilling the authorities of the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan. On October 3 1993, as a result of the nationwide vote, Heydar Aliyev was elected President of the Republic of Azerbaijan. He led our country for 10 years until he passed away. We will always remember our national leader Heydar Aliyev with love, respect and admiration.

On 8 May 2024 at 11.30 an event “Follow the steps of the leader and be a winner” dedicated to the 101 anniversary of the nationwide leader Heydar Aliyev was held at the Assembly Hall. Ulvi Mehdiyev, the chairman of the State Agency for Public Service under the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan (ASAN Service) talked about Heydar Aliyev’s honorable life, his struggle for the independence of our country and the importance of knowing our history.

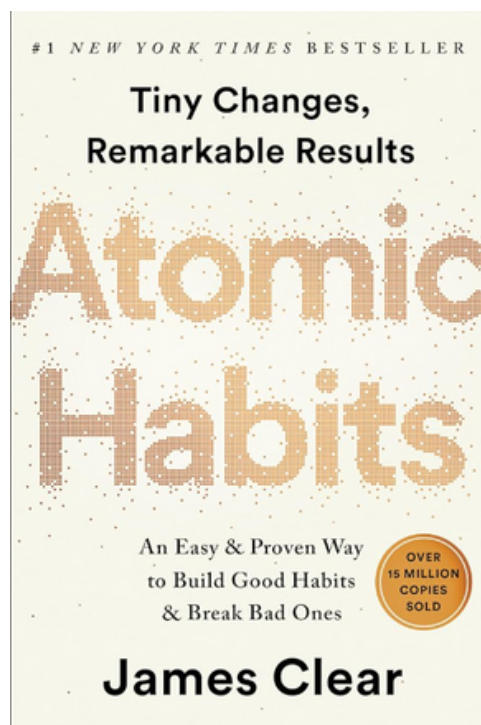


Book Review: Atomic Habits By Koroghlu Rahimli 8Ri Student

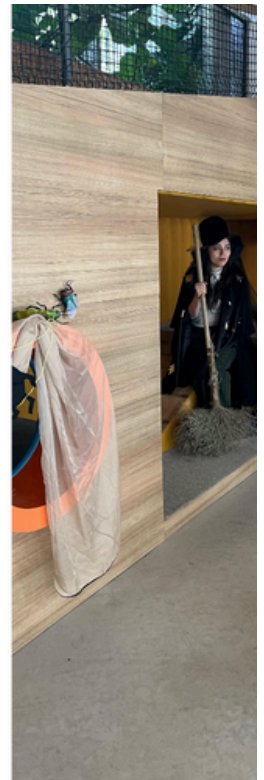

An encouraging English Week

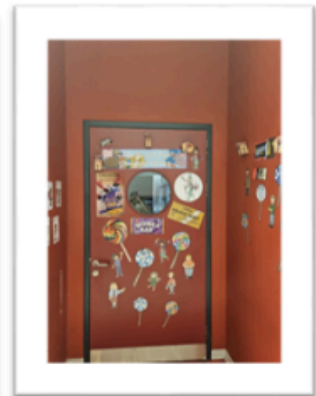

Profile: Meet our College Counslor Ms. Aysel Aliyeva

NU-Good afternoon Ms. Aysel and thank you very much for accepting this invitation to have a chat and help the MTK community to get to know our college counsellor.

How are you, Ms. Aysel?

AA- Good afternoon, Mr. Nelson. It's my pleasure to be here and thank you for the invitation. I'm excited to be interviewed by you to be perfectly honest.

NU-Let's begin from the beginning, where are you from?

AA- Certainly. I'm originally from Baku and I have been living here since I was born.

NU-You speak English quite fluently, where did you learn the language?

AA- Well, I started learning English at school and I completed my bachelor's degree in English language at university. I practiced learning English language in various settings. Besides formal education at school and university, I actively engaged in conversations with native speakers, participated in language exchange programs, and immersed myself in English-speaking environments through reading books, watching movies, and listening to music.

NU-How long have you been working at MTK?

AA- I have been working at MTK since last August.

NU- What is the service that the college counselor office offers to our students?

AA- Well, there are hundreds of universities, and choosing the right college can be a challenging task. As a university counselor, I assist students in researching universities and then narrowing the list of universities down to focus on. To be more precise, this involves engaging both students and parents in discussions to ascertain their academic strengths and preferences, guide students through the application process, ensuring they are well-equipped to pursue their top selections confidently.

NU-Do you enjoy your role?

AA-Definitely! I truly enjoy my role as a university counselor. Being able to support and guide students through their academic journey brings me a great sense of fulfillment.

NU-Where can students find you on the school campus?

AA- I am in Admission office, on the ground floor.

NU-How did you prepare for your role as the college counselor?



AA- I started by thoroughly researching university websites, and undergraduate program requirements. As is obvious, each university has its own set of entry requirements. Then I joined virtual webinars hosted by UCAS and various universities. And most importantly, I periodically visit study fairs and personally meet university representatives to remain well-informed about the recent updates and assist students effectively.

NU-Tell us about the latest university fairs we hosted at MTK and the fairs that are coming soon.

AA- Thank you for asking. Sure, MTK has recently hosted a study fair and some prestigious international university representatives personally met with our students and provided advice and information about studying abroad, tuition fees, enrolment procedures. Additionally, we do expect a visit from Sabanchi university on 16th of May. Generally, there is expected to be held an international fair in our complex, with the participation of 30 universities on October 10.

NU-We definitely hope that our students will take advantage of such an important service. In the end a smooth college allocation process will make a difference and is decisive in the future of our graduates.

On a more personal level, and to get to know the person behind the role, is there any book or movie that has inspired you?

AA- To be honest, I do not like to read novels much, in fact I almost never do. In last summer, I wanted to try something different and that was "The Alchemist" by P.Coelho. The story is about a young shepherd who is dreaming about finding treasure. I would say this book is filled with lots of hidden messages. To be more precise, if we follow our dreams, believe in ourselves and don't give up on what we believe in, it will be our destiny.

NU-What attribute(s) of your personality do you feel has(have) helped you to overcome challenges in life?

AA- I would say staying positive in difficult times and never give up believing myself.

NU-Any message or recommendation for the younger generations to succeed in the life beyond school?

AA- I would recommend students to study well and focus on their long-term goals. It is the key to success.

NU-Ms. Aysel, you have been very generous with your time and your kind answers. On behalf of the MTK community we wish you all the best in your current role and future projects of extending the career readiness program to earlier levels in the school.

A Band Review: My Chemical Romance

You might have heard about them, or you might not have. You might not have recognized their name, but you have indubitably heard at least one of their songs.

Formed in New Jersey in 2001 as a rock band, they originally debuted with four members: vocalist Gerard Way; bassist Mikey Way; former drummer Matt Pelissier, and lead guitarist Ray Toro, afterwards joined by the rhythm guitarist Frank Iero. The band's bassist Mikey came up with the band's name after he saw a book called 'Ecstasy: Three Tales of Chemical Romance' while working in a Barnes & Noble shop.

Their debut record, 'I Brought You My Bullets, You Brought Me Your Love' was released only ten months after their formation. This album's vocals have a more raw and hardcore sound to it, as Gerard Way was suffering from physical and mental health problems during the recording.

The band, which started as a small and unknown band playing tiny gigs in basements, quickly rose to popularity in 2004 with their second album 'Three Cheers for Sweet Revenge.' This album's edgy and unique themes deemed it one of the most iconic albums of the year. With their newfound popularity in the alternative rock scene, they got to play in the well-known touring music festival 'Warped Tour' in the summers of 2004 and 2005.

Gaining more followers from their concerts, they released their third and most successful album of all time, 'The Black Parade' in 2006. This record includes recognizable tracks, such as: "Welcome to the Black Parade," 'Famous Last Words,' and 'Teenagers.' As a concept album, The Black Parade's story is encapsulating, touching on the topics of loss, tragedy, diseases, acceptance, and afterlife. MCR instantaneously gained a resolute fanbase following the release of this record.

Four years after The Black Parade, the band released their finale album, 'Danger Days: The True Lives of the Fabulous Killjoys,' also referred to as 'Danger Days.' This album was not very well received within the community, as it displayed a softer, more pop-like genre than the rest of their albums. Nevertheless, the album still holds a special place in many fans' hearts with its colorful aesthetic and alluring story and characters.

No matter what you may think about this band, it is undeniable that they've had a huge impact on the music industry in the 2000s and have helped lots of people to feel confident with the relatable feelings they were able to exhibit with their lyric writing and story-telling.
